PARKING	Refer to the map of the stadium area for information regarding entry into the
	parking lot for your buses and trucks. Parking attendants will assist you with
	parking your vehicles.
STORAGE	There is no inside storage space provided. Please use your buses and equipment
	trucks for storage of equipment and cases.

CHECK-IN	Arrive and check-in 60 minutes prior to the start of your warm- up time. The check-in station is in the bus/equipment truck parking lot where you will be welcomed by a parent or student volunteer.
	Please turn in any last-minute forms at this time. (Announcer Script, Form I Eligibility Certification, Compliance Form)
	You will receive a packet of complimentary admission wristbands (1 for every 10 band members) to give at your discretion to chaperones and bus drivers.)
	Buses and equipment trucks will unload and park in the lot where you check-in, however, under certain circumstances buses may be asked to park in another location. Students may use the restrooms located under the Visitor Side bleachers to change into their uniforms. Please provide chaperones to assist the students with leaving the facilities free of litter, uniform bags, personal items, etc.
	A monitor will stay with your band for the duration of check-in to field exit. Once students are in uniform, and approximately 20 minutes prior to the start of your warm-up period, your monitor will escort your
	band to the designated warm-up area. Following warm-up, the same monitor will take your band to the stadium.
	Your pit is responsible for getting themselves to warm-up and to the stadium. Pit entrance is the same as the band entrance.
FORM 1	The Form 1 Eligibility Certification, signed by the campus principal or superintendent, must be submitted to Fran Badrak no later than the day of contest. The form must list the names of the band students that are eligible to participate in this UIL competition.
WARM-UP	 Warm-up time is 45 minutes. Refer to site map for warm-up locations. Pit percussionists have a separate warm-up area. Color guard remains with the band during warm-up. The use of wireless transmitters (metronomes or PA's) in the warm-up areas is strictly prohibited. Any amplified metronome must be hard-wired and facing away from the stadium. We reserve the right to ask bands to turn down or turn off amplified metronomes if they are heard in the stadium. The RES and the contest host should make every effort to ensure non-essential wireless frequencies in a venue are turned off and any active frequencies are communicated to the participating bands in advance of the contest. There will be no "restarts", delays" or "do-overs" due to any issue related to electronics. Wireless devices may be tested ONLY during contest intermissions and during the 7-minute period that includes any band's 2-minute field exit and 5-minute field entrance. This includes bands in warm-up and other areas around the stadium. Your warm-up time begins when the warm-up monitor states, "Your warm-up

	 time may begin." Playing of instruments is allowed only in the warm-up areas and on the field during performance. Make sure students play away from the stadium during warm-up and keep percussion volume at a minimum. A monitor will advise you when it is time to move to the ready position. For the contest to remain on schedule, it is essential that you proceed promptly and efficiently when directed. Please be courteous to the monitors, as they are doing their best to help you as well as all others following you
FIELD ENTRANCE	Field entrance and exit for each band is located on the Visitor Side (see map). Bands need to follow the field monitor's instructions at this point.
PERFORMANCE REGULATIONS	1) Performance Time. Each competing band shall occupy the football field for not less than five nor more than eight minutes. Any band that leaves the field in less than five minutes or fails to complete its performance in eight minutes shall be penalized one rating.
	(2) Movement to Field Position. The contest chair has determined the ready position for each band will be the goal line. This position shall provide efficient and prompt access to the football field without interfering with other bands as they perform. The front ensemble will advance to the 20-yard line during the 2 min exit of the previous band's performance.
	(3) Official Time. The official time for each band will be kept according to the following: (A) The contest chair will designate an official timekeeper.
	(B) To allow ample time for the judges to complete their critiques, bands will be scheduled with five minutes between performances and a maximum of fifteen minutes per band.
	(C) Warm-up or pre-show is permitted during the 5-minute setup period, however, judges will be instructed that activity on the field will not be judged until they see 7:59 on the clock. If you do not wish to utilize the entire 5 minutes of setup time, you may hold your band at the field entrance to coordinate your ready time with the beginning of the announcement.
	(D) Each band will be announced with 45 seconds remaining on the 5-minute clock. The beginning of their announcement will indicate that the performance time will begin in 45 seconds.
	(E) The actual timing and adjudication for the show will begin at the end of the five minutes.

- (F) At the conclusion of each band's performance the postscript will be read. The band will have two minutes to exit the field and clear the marching surface of all equipment, instruments and props. The use of either instrumental or verbal cadence is optional. A band that fails to be clear of the field (outside the sidelines or endlines) or continues to use instrumental or verbal cadence at the end of the two minutes will be disqualified.
- (G) A band leaving equipment or instruments on the sideline in such a manner that these items impede the movement of the next band into its starting position will be subject to penalty in accordance with Subchapter E.
- (H) Electronic Equipment. <u>ELECTRONICS AND AMPLIFICATION IN UIL MBC</u> PERFORMANCES UPDATED 2022-2023
- (I) Electronic cables may now cross the sidelines. Students may NOT perform over cables that are on the field, whether they are covered or not.
- (J) A non-student may intervene during the 8-minute performance clock to address an electronics failure. The school must supply the contest chair with a written justification for doing so. If the RES and contest chair determine that the justification does not support the action, the REC may proceed with consideration of penalty.
- (K) The Marching Band Rules Advisory Committee passed a proposal recommending that verbal band critiques by judges at the region MBC be created utilizing Competition Suite. The evaluation form will still be one on paper.

TIMING &	Preparation and performance time will be kept according to the UIL Constitution
CLOCK	and Contest Rules, Section 1105 (h) (3) Official Time.
PROTOCOL	
	 At the designated time, a field monitor cues your band to enter the field. At that time, the 5-minute setup period begins, and timing is displayed on the stadium clock. With 45 seconds remaining on the 5-minute clock, the announcer reads the
	Opening Script which begins with, "THE (FIRST, NEXT, FINAL) BAND IN CONFERENCE"
	• With 20 seconds remaining on the 5-minute clock, the next statement beginning with, "DRUM MAJORS," is read. As the "DRUM MAJORS"
	statement is read, the stadium clock is reset to 8 minutes. The official timer in the press box starts the 8-minute clock at the end of the 5-minute warm-up period.
	• Warm-up or pre-show is permitted during the 5-minute setup period, however, judges are instructed that activity on the field will not be judged until they see 7:59 on the clock. If you do not wish to utilize the entire 5 minutes of setup time, you may hold your band at the field entrance to coordinate your ready time with the beginning of the

PROPS	Props enter and exit with the band. Refer to <i>Marching Band Props</i> in the C&CR for specific information. Props
ELECTRONICS	Refer to <i>Use of Electronics in UIL Marching Band Contest Performances</i> in the C&CR. <u>Use of Electronics</u>
STADIUM WIRELESS FREQUENCIES	Stadiums typically provide the use of a wireless microphone system for officials at football games or for on-field presentations. Most often, these systems are powered on even when not in use, creating the potential for interference in the form of unwanted audio. Being aware of these frequencies may help you avoid interference with your band's wireless system.
	A good practice is to perform a sound check of your wireless equipment during your 5-minute setup. The 5-minute clock will not be stopped if you experience electronic issues of any kind.

A designated area in the stands is available for videography; the video deck is not available. UIL Music Region 11 does not coordinate the availability of a professional/nonprofessional videographer and does not assume any copyright liabilities. Note : A school must complete and submit the <i>Marching Band Educational Use Video Agreement</i> no later than seven days prior to the contest where the school wishes to video their marching band's performance. The agreement form can be found here: Video Agreement By completing the video agreement, you are permitted one camera and operator on the video area during your band's performance. Please be courteous of others who also have permission to occupy the video space. Thank you.
VENDORS	PepWear and Southwest Emblem will be on site to sell various band apparel and patches.
FIRST AID & WATER STATIONS	Professional medical assistance will be provided at the First Aid Station located in the Visitor Side locker room.

	 Please follow standard emergency protocol: a) Director/Contest staff member escorts/transports student to First Aid Station. Director must be informed ASAP if a student needs first aid. b) Assessment is made and treatment protocol followed. c) If EMS transport is needed, first aid staff contacts student's band director and/or student's parent/guardian. d) Director/Contest staff member notifies Executive Secretary of the situation. Although water stations are provided at warm-up, First Aid, and field exit, we strongly encourage all students and directors to hydrate accordingly prior to arrival.

	The ticket booth will open an hour before the first performance.
	\$10.00 General Admission. No reserved seats. Re-entry is allowed as long as wristband is intact. No free wristband replacements. No senior/military discounts. Cash and/or Credit Cards accepted.
	Free admission for: Children 4 and under. Participating Band Members (wearing band shirt/uniform). Administrators with UIL Pass.
	Spectators are not allowed to enter or park by the buses and trucks. See map for spectator parking. Access in and out of the stands is restricted during each band's performance. Entrances to the seating area is closed with two minutes left on the clock of each band's setup period. Please inform your stakeholders of this courtesy and advise them to arrive with plenty of time to get seated before the entrances close. Thank you.
CONCESSIONS	Typical concessions will be provided. Please advise your students to dispose of leftovers/trash properly.
INSTRUMENT REPAIR	Instrument repair will be provided by High School Music Company and will be located between the warm-up areas.
POST PERFORMANCE	After your monitor escorts the band through the field exit, return to your buses and equipment truck(s). Students may reenter the stadium if they are in uniform or wearing a band shirt. Student seating is on the Visitor Side; however, students may visit the vendor booths and concession stand on the home side by exiting the stadium and re-entering on the Home Side. Students are expected to follow their school's conduct policy as well as the stadium policies.
